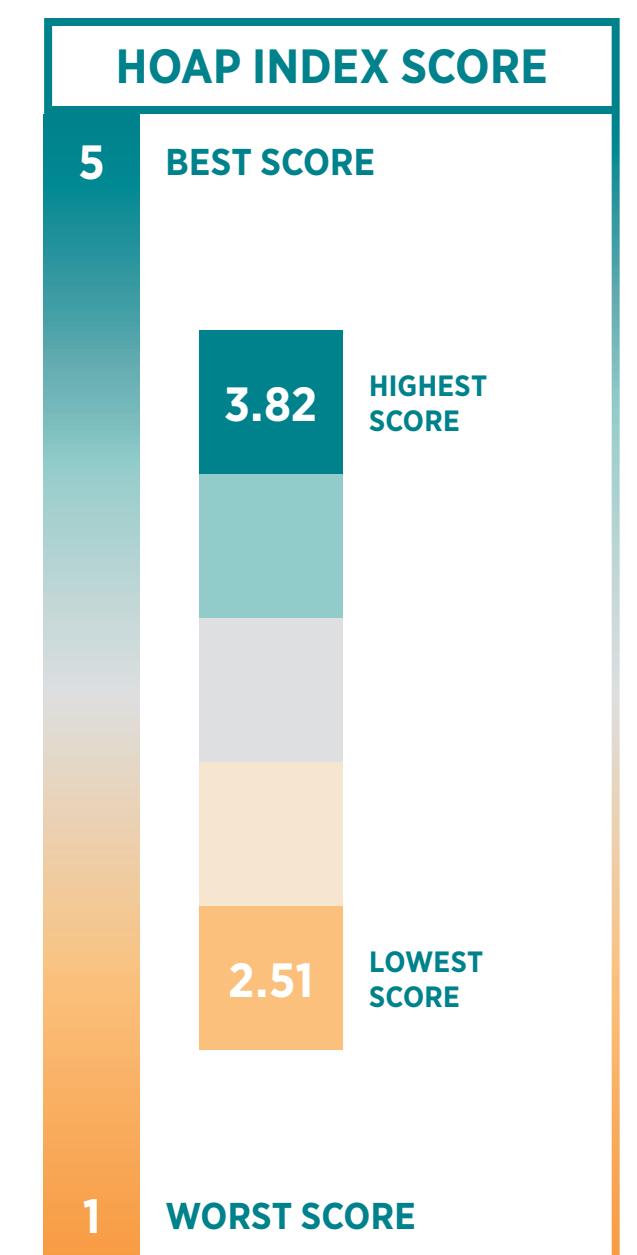
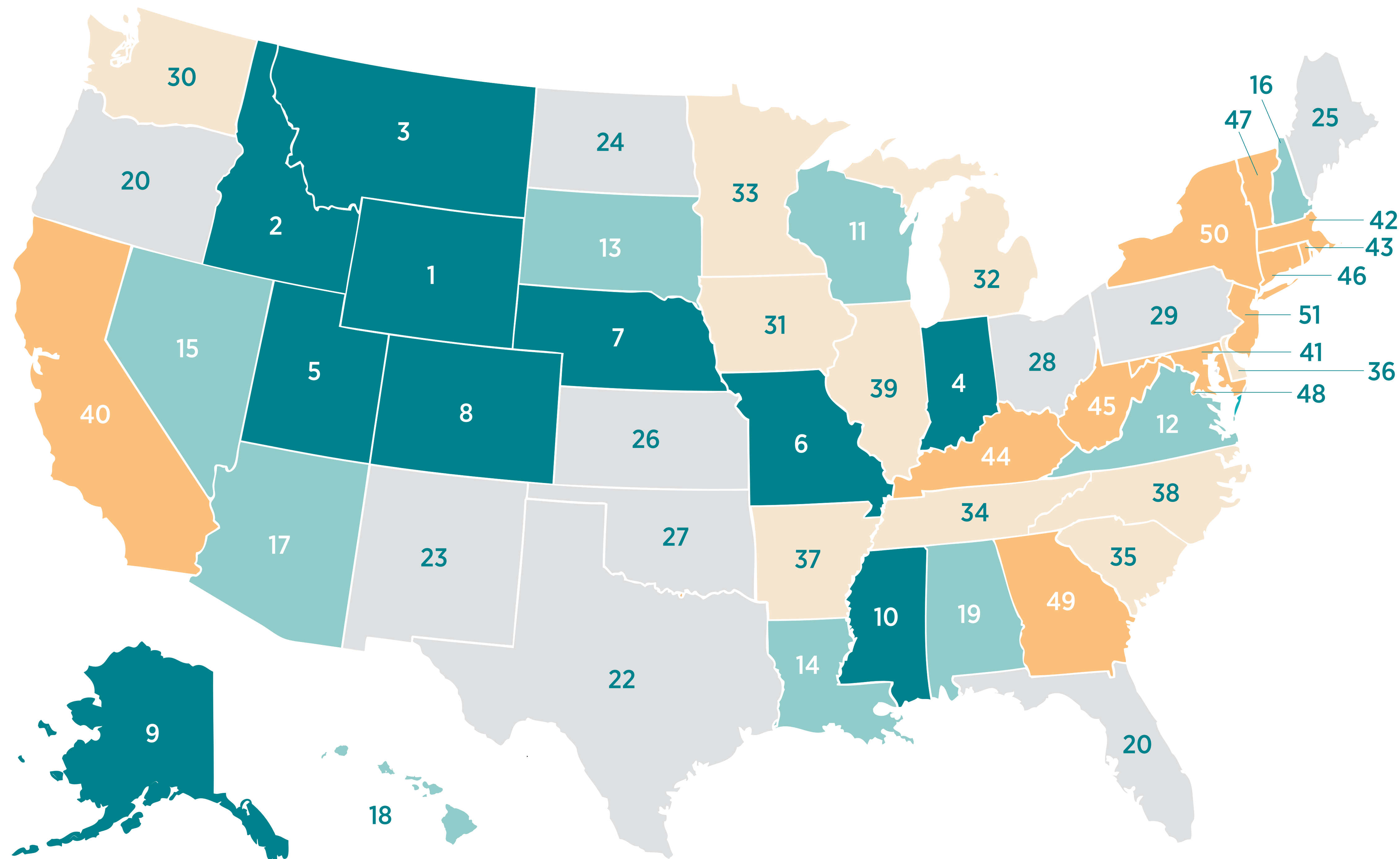
## 2018
